Many different events can cause trauma, and the emotions and physical reactions they cause can continue long after the event has occurred. Trauma and Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) can have lasting effects on the individual's daily functioning including possible changes in mental, physical, social, emotional, and spiritual health.

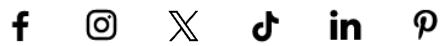
